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1. MBA (PGCET) INDUSTRIAL VISIT

The Department of Management Studies organised an industrial visit to IFB Industries Ltd., Malur, Karnataka, for MBA II Semester (PGCET Batch 2024–26) students, aimed at providing hands-on exposure to industrial operations and bridging classroom learning with practical experience. The visit took place on Thursday, 15th July 2025, and was coordinated by Dr Syed Ahmed and reported by Dr Vidhya Pillai. A total of 45 students along with 2 faculty members participated in the visit.



IFB Industries Ltd., a leading manufacturer of home appliances, offered students a guided tour of its facility focusing on the production of washing machines. The session began with an orientation, followed by walkthroughs of various departments.

The key learning objectives included:

- Exposure to assembly lines and automation
- Insights into quality control and safety measures
- Understanding lean manufacturing and operational workflows
- Observing sustainable and eco-friendly practices

The students gained a real-world perspective on industrial functioning, supply chain logistics, and organizational coordination. The visit reinforced theoretical concepts and inspired greater interest in manufacturing and operations. Overall, the visit was a valuable experiential learning opportunity that strengthened the student's academic and professional outlook

2. ONE DAY FACULTY WORKSHOP

As part of IFIM College's commitment to continuous professional development, a one-day workshop titled "Empowering Educators: Data-Driven Decisions Using JMP" was conducted on Friday, 4th July 2025, The workshop was organized by Dr Nataraja N S, Area Chair – Business Analytics, and was attended by 38 faculty members. The session was facilitated by Dr Muralidhara Anandamurthy, Academic Lead, JMP Software (Statistical Discovery from SAS).



The workshop aimed to equip educators with essential skills in data analysis, visualization, and statistical decision-making using JMP software, widely recognized for its applications in academic and research environments.

The session was divided into three key modules:

- Introduction to JMP and its application in data-driven academic planning
- Descriptive and inferential statistics for educators
- Hands-on exercises focused on visualizing institutional data and deriving insight

Participants engaged in practical sessions exploring data import, interactive dashboards, hypothesis testing, and regression analysis.

The workshop successfully bridged statistical tools with academic application, empowering faculty members to apply data-driven strategies in teaching, curriculum design, and institutional research. It was a meaningful initiative promoting data literacy and research orientation among educators.





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3. MIND SPARK BCA ACTIVITY

As part of its continued emphasis on innovation and experiential learning, IFIM College organized Mind Spark 2025 – a Creative Coding Presentation for second-year BCA students. The event was conducted on Wednesday, 2nd July 2025, at IFIM College, under the leadership of Dr Sunetra Chatterjee, supported by Dr Rajkumar. The event saw participation from 60 students and 4 faculty members, with Prof. Nikhil Gupta serving as judge and chief guest.





The objective of Mind Spark was to ignite creative thinking and technical exploration by encouraging students to address real-world societal challenges using modern technologies such as AI, NLP, Cyber Security, Java, and Python. The event aimed to bridge classroom knowledge with practical implementation.

The event featured 10 student teams, each presenting solutions to societal issues through technology. The sessions emphasized technical innovation, collaboration, and problem-solving.

Winning projects included:

- Team Error Mental health tracking using AI & NLP
- Team Techno Cyber safety model against phishing attacks

Mind Spark successfully fostered confidence, communication, and awareness of how tech can solve real-world problems. The enthusiastic engagement of students and expert feedback made it a truly impactful initiative.

4. ONE-ACT PLAY

As part of the Personality Enhancement Programme (PEP), the Department of Personality Enhancement Programme hosted a vibrant One-Act Play competition for BCA and BCom students on 4th July 2025, at the college auditorium. The event aimed at nurturing students' creativity, communication, and leadership abilities through the art of theatre.





The competition provided a vibrant platform for students to explore performance arts and build essential life skills. Each team consisted of ten members and was given 10 minutes for their act, in addition to setup and exit time. The plays were performed in English, and teams were encouraged to select their own themes—ranging from comedy, social satire, and psychological drama to emotional and moral narratives. Props, sound effects, and costumes were made mandatory, pushing students to deliver professional and polished performances.

The judging panel included five esteemed faculty members:

The event concluded with a formal vote of thanks, certificate distribution, and a group photograph session. The college also presented tokens of appreciation to the judges for their contribution.

Beyond entertainment, the event instilled vital skills such as confidence in public speaking, teamwork, time management, creativity, and critical thinking. Students also learned about event marketing and visibility through digital promotions and posters. The One Act Play competition was a resounding success—bringing together performance, purpose, and personality development in perfect harmony.

5. POSTER MAKING CHALLENGE

In a fast-paced and thought-provoking session held on 7th July 2025, MBA 2nd Semester PGCET Section B students of IFIM College participated in a Poster Making Challenge themed "The Role of HR Managers in 2025". The event, thoughtfully conceptualized and conducted by Prof. Ramini Singh, aimed to cultivate innovative thinking and real-time application of HR concepts in a highly engaging format.



The activity challenged students to work in teams with no use of mobile phones or digital tools, relying solely on their understanding, creativity, and collaboration. Participants were given 30 minutes to design their posters using information drawn from leading sources such as People Matters, Business World, India Today, Mint, and Economic Times. One team member from each group was then invited to present their poster to the class.

The challenge encouraged students to explore the evolving landscape of human resource management—touching on trends like AI integration, mental well-being, DEI (Diversity, Equity & Inclusion), and leadership in hybrid workspaces. More than an art activity, it was a reflection of strategic thinking under time constraints.

This hands-on approach not only reinforced classroom learning but also sharpened essential skills like teamwork, time management, business communication, and industry awareness. It exemplified IFIM's commitment to experiential education—where students are prepared to think critically, communicate effectively, and lead confidently in real-world scenarios.

6. FINAL STEP IN IIP JOURNEY

As part of IFIM College's effort to enhance student engagement and experiential learning, a digital platform titled "Catalyst" was introduced for MBA students during their Industry Internship Program (IIP). This initiative was aligned with the college's goal to bridge academic theory with corporate practice through structured project-based learning.





Catalyst was actively used during the IIP phase from May to July 2025, involving all MBA IV Semester students. The platform allowed students to systematically document their learning, track internship progress, and receive timely feedback from assigned faculty mentors.

The use of Catalyst was focused on the following key aspects:

- Internship Documentation and structured reporting
- Progress Monitoring through timely updates and reflections
- Mentor Engagement for continuous guidance and feedback

The platform helped in streamlining communication between students and faculty, enabling goal-setting, time management, and the application of theoretical knowledge in real-world business scenarios.

Catalyst significantly enhanced the internship experience by creating a more organized and goal-driven approach to learning. It also promoted accountability, digital literacy, and self-discipline among students.
